Vaccination Recommendation

- Applicants who have not been vaccinated are recommended to consider the following basic vaccinations: Hepatitis B, DKTP-HiB (diphtheria, whooping cough, tetanus, polio, Haemophilus influenzae type B), pneumococcal, and MMR (mumps, measles, rubella).
- This recommendation is based on the already high vaccination levels in Aruba and our endeavor to maintain it.

Importance of Vaccination for Permit Holders

- 1. **Community Protection:** Vaccination protects both individuals and those with whom permit holders come into contact.
- 2. **Continuity of Services and Economic Activities:** Reduced disease risk contributes to uninterrupted service and economic activity.
- 3. **Trust and Credibility:** Willingness to vaccinate demonstrates commitment to the health and safety of others.

Facts about Vaccination

- Safety: Vaccines undergo extensive testing for safety and effectiveness by health authorities.
- **Protection against Severe Diseases:** Besides reducing infection risk, vaccines also prevent severe illnesses and alleviate symptoms' severity.
- **Herd Immunity:** A high vaccination rate in the community safeguards even those who are not vaccinated.
